

## A Primer about our Ocean Village Beach System

What does our location on the Atlantic Ocean mean for the viability of our beachfront?

We are on the open sea. Unlike protected Long Island Sound, for example, we are influenced by the Gulfstream and storms that start in the Caribbean. We absorb the trends, waves, winds, and currents of a big body of water. Those influences mean that we sometimes get sand erosion, and at other times we get sand accretion.

## Do the dimensions of the beach change at different times of the year?

Yes. Depending on the seasonal flow, whether it is northerly or southerly, we can get accretion or erosion.

## Why does our barrier island get so much sand erosion?

In the 1920s, Fort Pierce dug out the area now known as the Fort Pierce Jetty. In doing so, it interrupted the north-south flow of sand. That's why Pepper Park is so great for surfing, as the area gets lots of sand deposits. But the area below the jetty is depleted of sand on a frequent basis. Federal and state funding in past years has paid for sand replenishment south of the jetty, but funding this year is tenuous.

## How is our location on a barrier island on the Atlantic Ocean special?

We are a nesting site for endangered sea turtles. That's why you see people filling in holes that people dig on the beach. We also have legal limitations on light pollution

directed at the beach, as we want to offer sea turtles the optimal nesting conditions.

## How does the dune figure into the success of our Ocean Village community?

Our mature dune system is not a product of coincidence. It is a carefully planned and curated ecosystem of Florida-friendly, drought-resistant, native, and rare plants. We also must monitor the entire half mile dune for invasives, as they can suffocate the plants we have installed over the years.

#### How else is the dune important?

The dune protects the Village from the onslaught of the fierce ocean. So many communities up and down the Atlantic coast have succumbed to devastating storms. We are lucky to have this dune system in place, but we must never take it for granted. We must constantly step up to act and protect it. You can join in and be part of the solution.

### How do owners at Ocean Village help maintain the beach?

One of the ways is through our active Blue Tube program. At each crossover we have a container that volunteers fill with plastic bags from grocery stores. Each time people walk on the beach, they grab one of these plastic bags. It becomes a receptacle for litter that is thrown up on the beach due to tides and storms. We often find deep

sea debris with barnacles or non-English writing on them.

## What else can owners do to help the beach and dune system at Ocean Village?

- Volunteer to help the committee on its various projects.
- Join one of our weeding groups, which help us to keep landscaping costs lower.
  - Participate in our beach cleanups.
  - Attend the guest lecture series.
- Help market and publicize information we have assembled over the years with your technical savvy.
- Share what you know about our very special dune system with others.

## Have you published anything about the dune system for owners to read?

Yes. A working group wrote an academic paper about our dune system. If you want a copy, email c4tuna31@gmail.com and you'll get a

digital copy sent to you.

### How can we learn more about life on the dune?

Owner Lee Hearn has identified the majority of plants and creatures on our dune and created a dune catalog. It's a wonderful compilation. Right now it's only available as a series of Word files. If you know how to use Instagram or create an app, get in touch, please. We can use your help to compile the information in an easily accessible platform for our owners.

## Are there everyday activities that I should embrace in order to protect our ocean and dune systems?

Yes, there are.

• Stop using single use plastics. Marine creatures are attracted to them, as they smell like food. Statistics show the majority of mortality findings for marine animals are due to plastics wrapping around intestinal features.

- Bring reusable tableware to your picnic. So many of the plastics that are strewn along our beach are from disposable forks, knives, etc.
- When you go to sit on the beach, turn off your phone. Instead, allow yourself to be mindful of the nature around you the migrating birds, the height and direction of the waves, the cloud formations, the variety of shells at your feet.
- Teach yourself about the importance of our dune for the sake of appreciation and nurturing.

Fall in the Remembrance Garden brought more activity as the rains abated and the temperature dropped, albeit slightly. The skeletons of summer blossoms were ripped out, and several new species took their place. As I step away from my position in the Garden, I am working to make the Garden less demanding. Therefore, Master Gardner Lillian Aguiar and I shopped for perennial shrubs that took up space and needed little maintenance.

Fortunately, the "Plant Lady," Jane Gehring, arrived in Ocean Village just in time to help get the new purchases in the ground. Our favorite, heretofore unknown to any of us three, is the "Musical Note" plant. A member of the Clerodendrum group, which includes the "Bleeding Heart," this lesser known variety is unusual in that it is a short shrub, native to Africa, that grows from three to five feet high.

We chose it because it is a perennial that needs little pruning and produces flowers regularly in temperate weather. While utilitarian, the "Musical Note" is not just taking up space, but has blooms that are show-stoppers. The plant produces blooms at night that are clustered like a fist with each finger opening and

expanding into about four-inch, delicate strands that terminate into a elliptical circle that resembles an eighth note on a musical score. These, in turn, split down the middle, creating what looks like a tiny, white butterfly.

As the "Musical Note" is a night bloomer, the best time to catch it is probably mornings. You will find one just inside the jasmine covered arch and the other near the top of the walk between the sculpture and the Norfolk Island pine.


Players are clamoring to resume our in-house competition! We are waiting for more players to arrive but expect to start in early November. Watch for news at the courts.

#### **Fee Adjustment Approved**

Following a special community vote, 68% of members supported a fee increase to be determined by the **POA BOD** — the <u>first</u> increase in over a decade, to be effective December 1, 2025.

#### **Golf Fees**

To be determined, as of this writing Equipment rental hikes were approved in the spring, and the items and updated pricing are listed to the right.

#### Why a Rate Increase Makes Sense

Our seasonal golf fees haven't changed in over a

decade, despite rising costs in course maintenance, staffing, and operations. We've worked hard to absorb these increases, but to maintain the quality of the course and service you deserve, a rate adjustment is necessary. Furthermore, it makes sense that those who actively use this amenity should contribute proportionally to the golf course upkeep. This adjustment ensures continued investment in course quality, sustainable turf management, and your overall golfing experience. The average price of a par 3 (9 holes) golf course, walking, in Florida is \$29. Frankly, with any (proposed) price increase, 9 holes at Ocean Village Golf Course will still be an amazing bargain. It is a good investment for our overall property value, too.

JD and his teammates have captured world titles in the 50+, 55+, 60+ and 65+ age brackets.

Their international competition schedule has taken them to Portugal, Mexico, Italy, Costa Rica, Switzerland, Argentina, and Brazil, with new destinations added every year. On occasion, they compete here in Florida — always a thrill for those fortunate enough to watch them play.

Looking ahead, JD is preparing to compete in the

**70+ category** in several major tournaments scheduled for **2026**, including Palm Beach (FL), Mesquite (NV), the Pan American Tournament in El Salvador, Coral Springs Nationals, the Indianapolis Masters, and the Huntsman World Senior Games.

Reflecting on his long career and the camaraderie that comes with it, JD shared, "Just representing the USA brings us close together and we compete with pride."

JD and his wife, Maria, moved from Coral Gables to Ocean Village in 2020 and are year-round residents of our community.




