# The Remembrance Garden

The Remembrance Garden is thrilled to report we received several generous donations in April. A huge Thank You goes out to the Ocean Village Worship group, the ladies of AWOL, and to Duke and Barbara Thompson for their very generous contributions to the Garden. We also thank all of those who chose a brick in the Garden Walk as a way to memorialize a loved one or commemorate an event. It had been a lean year, but now we have been able to have the Black Olive tree in the center trimmed for the hurricane season and still have money for a few new plants and the always-needed mulch and fertilizers necessary to get us through the summer and fall.

In an effort to discourage the rabbits, which are a bane to our garden, we have experimented with several new plants. Advised that rabbits do not like fuzzy textures, we have planted a variety of Celosia Argentea. Of the over 60 varieties of this Amaranth family, many of you may be familiar with the one commonly known as Cockscomb for its resemblance to a rooster's topknot. Two other types are the wheat and the plume.

The name Celosia comes from Greek, meaning "burning," referencing the flame-like flower. Our variety, the plume, known as "Plumosa," has bright green foliage with stems of tall, spiky, feather-like plumes.

We have hot orange ones on the east side of the Garden, and red and yellow ones are at the top of the stairs. So far, we

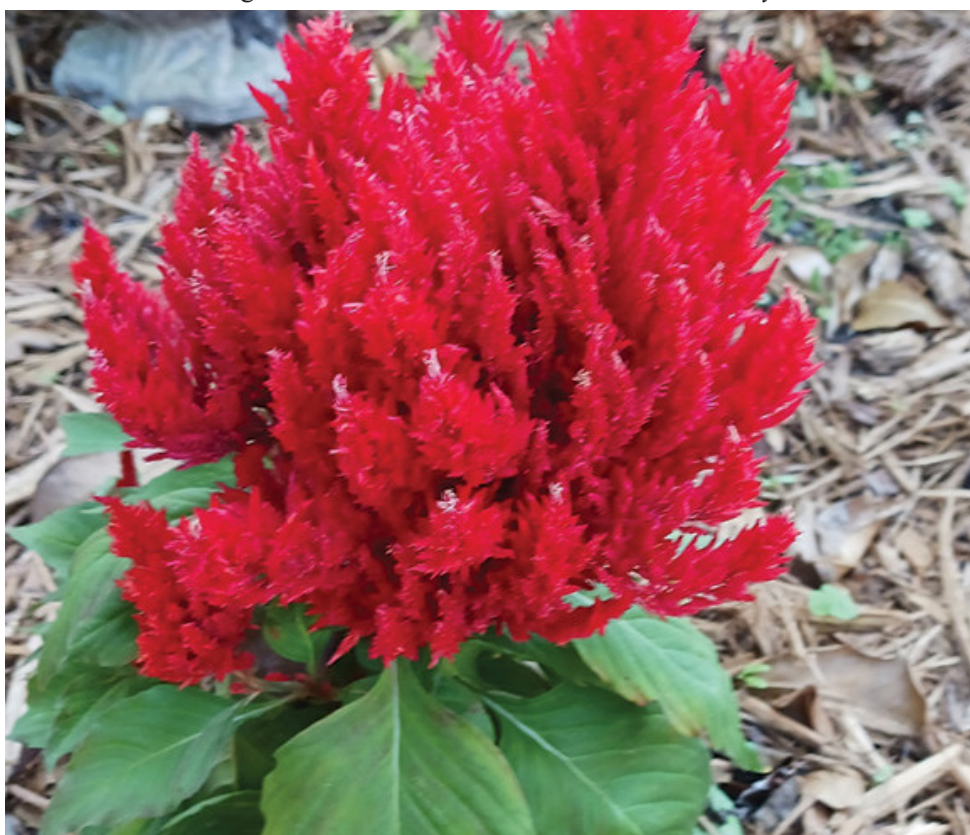
have lost none to the rabbits.

My intrepid workers, Nance Willford and Jane Gehring, will depart for the north in early May. I will be out of OV for the entire month. Thanks to Candy Sullivan, Myrna Nickels, and Sylvia Parmelee, who have graciously agreed to help with watering. They are most appreciated and also lucky to get to spend some wonderful time in the most beautiful place in Ocean Village.

## OV Book Club Meets to Discuss *The Faith Club*

RoseAnn Rouff and Janet Surret led the discussion on the non-fiction novel, *The Faith Club*, by Ranya Idliby, Suzanne Oliver, and Priscilla Warner - a Muslim, a Christian, and a Jew - three women who searched for understanding and common ground following the 9/11 attack on the NYC World Trade Center. These women initially decide to meet with the end goal of educating their children about their respective religions, as the dynamics of the current mood of the city was so daunting and divisive.

These three women, through their regular meetings, would never have guessed this would help provide life-changing answers that would forever alter their struggles with prejudice, fear, and anger. The Faith Club forces readers to face the tough questions about their own previous opinions of these religions. We all learned a great deal. Pioneering, timely, deeply thoughtful, and full of hope, The Faith Club's caring message resonated with acceptance of others.

The session began with a definition

of the words Faith, Religion, Spirituality, and Politics, which brought the topic into perspective.

What made this discussion so interesting is that everyone listened intently and contributed their thoughts on our current world-wide state of affairs. Some members are going to buy their own copy of the book as a reference guide! For example, we all learned we are "people of the book," which means the Torah, the Old Testament, and the Quran are all very similar in content based on Abrahamic religion. We have much in common!

One quote from the book worth repeating is, "Religion is not the enemy. Ignorance is." We agreed that if there was a profound respect and tolerance for other religions, the world would be a better place. Also, following the Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you," should be our ultimate goal. What a wonderful world that would be! We recommend this book highly to all readers who seek to learn more about these religions.

The first event of the season will be Toys for Tots on December 14. Check the bulletin boards for details and updates.

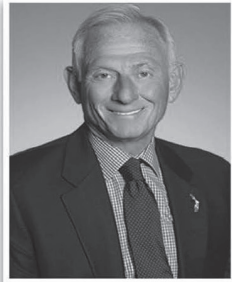

# Hank Wagner Memorial Tennis Event Held in April

On April 13, under bluebird skies, the Hank Wagner Memorial Tennis event was hosted by Hank's family. Hank bought in Ocean Village in 1983. He loved his family, his friends, and he loved Ocean Village. He was instrumental in bringing our pro, Emile deCuba, to OV. He was also involved with a group of tennis players who researched and fought to bring soft courts to Ocean Village. Hank had a stroke in 2014 and later that year he fought to take up tennis again, and would hit with Emile until almost the age of 90. He was a part of a generation of fun-loving tennis players here in OV, of which many of us are descendants.

Thirty-two participants, divided into teams of 4, rotated for 3 rounds on center court and courts 1-4.

The competition was fierce and fun. In the end, there was a 3-way tie for first place: Sandy Cole, Susie Herr and Dick Bittner. Following the matches, a luncheon was held on the Village Green and hosted by Hank's family.

All proceeds from the event were donated to Save the Chimps, an organization that supports a sanctuary in Fort Pierce for chimps who are rescued from research and the entertainment industry. There were no prizes in this event; the winner was a chimp named "Ace", a 28 year old male rescued from research. Hank's family adopted Ace in the name of the Ocean Village Tennis Committee.

The tennis committee has been saving used tennis balls at the courts and bringing them out to the sanctuary for years. The balls are needed for incentives and play activities with the chimps.

Linda Stephan, Hank's daughter, was chair of this event, assisted by her family and a crew of volunteers. Thanks to all members of Ocean Village who also made a donation to Save the Chimps.

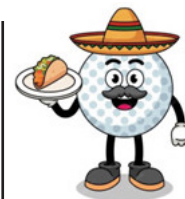

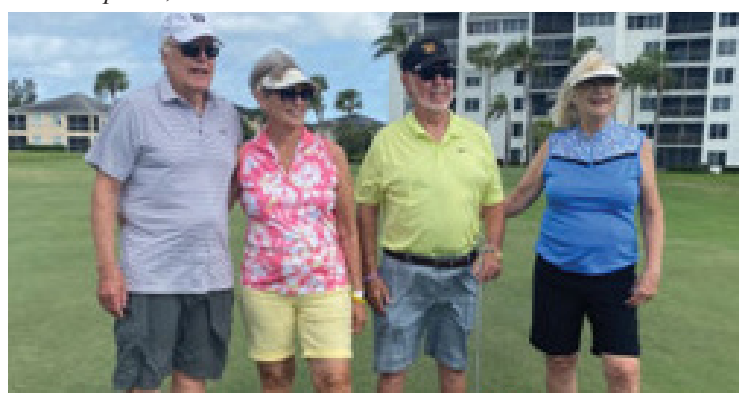

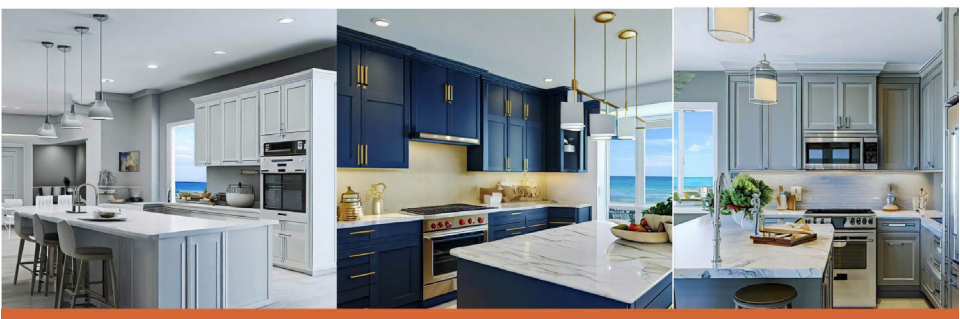
